

Hampton Conservation Commission

May 24th, 1976

The Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight O'clock, with Ednaparl Parr, Irene Palmer, Alide Lavallee, Neil MacPherson, and Ruth Nutter present. Mr. Lavallee and Mr.

MacPherson were welcomed as the new members to the Commission.

The minutes of the April 26th meeting were read and approved as read.

Under old business, Ednaparl reported that she had an audience with Mr. McGee, concerning the application of Mr. Farr. The latter's neighbor, Mr. Collins, has pictures showing flooded back yards at high tide. Also there are two four foot deep pools on Mr. Farr's property, which would cause the intervenor's property to be flooded by displacement <sup>of water.</sup> Mr. McGee has granted a delay of six weeks in order that these pictures may be brought to him, before arriving at a decision.

Under new business, Nelson presented an application from Fred Nixon, South River Road, Hampton. Type of project, a bulkhead to be 35 feet along the bank, constructed of woodposts and planks. Ednaparl made the motion, seconded by Mr. Macpherson, that the board looks upon the application favorably. It was so voted, unanimously.

Ednaparl reported that Gov. Thompson has signed the Mosquito Bill, which will enable those on the Committee to begin with larvicide operations.

Senator Preston proved to be of much assistance in getting this bill to the Governor.

The Secretary was requested to compose a letter to Ruth Stimson and Stillman Hobbs, long time members of this Commission, expressing our appreciation for their many contributions in their assisting in many different areas in connection with our work.

Our Chairman explained in detail the various steps covered in an application to dredge and fill.

He showed an application to our new members, told of it's being sent to the Special Board Water Resources, who in turn send it to our Commission, and of the many steps covered before a decision is reached. Information was also given them on steps to take when observing unlawful wet-lands filling, by phoning Mr. Chamberlain, Executive Secretary of The Special Board Water Resources.

Ednaparl and Irene spoke of the filling that has been going on for some time in the area in the rear of the St. Magnus Condominiums, opposite the Ruth Stimson Park. First rushes and reeds were cut down, then truck loads of fill, including rocks three feet in diameter were dumped in the area.

Concerned observers notified Mr. McGee that Fred Schaaque was doing this, and altho' he was told to cease and desist, he continued. At this point, the Attorney General has placed his case in the Supreme Court.

The Secretary was instructed to mail a list of our members and new officers, with address and phone numbers to the Environmental Coalition.

Ednapearl made the motion, seconded by Irene, that the Secretary write a letter to Mr. Lombardi, requesting that the check for \$500 which was favorably voted upon at Town Meeting be sent to her, and subsequently placed to our account in the Co-Operative Bank. The vote was unanimous.

Election of officers for the coming year was the last item of business. Ruth Nutter nominated Nelson for Chairman, which was seconded by Ednapearl. Ednapearl was nominated as Vice-Chairman, Ruth Nutter as Secretary, and Ed Loughlin as Treasurer. Irene moved that the nominations be closed, seconded by Mr. MacPherson, the nominating ballot became the elective ballot, and Nelson read the names of the newly elected officers.

The meeting was voted adjourned at 9:30
