

Hampton Conservation Commission

October 25th, 1976

The Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight ten, with Ednapearl Parr, Irene Palmer, Neil MacPherson and Ruth Nutter present.

The minutes of the August 23rd meeting were read and accepted as read.

Old business: Ednapearl spoke of the continuing problem on Bragg Avenue. She had talked to Mr. Chamberlain in Concord, and he agreed with her that the area was marsh land. At a recently held meeting, fifty six neighbors attended, and raised objections, as the land fill would extend 35 to 40 feet in to the marsh. Several loads of fill have already been placed there. In regard to the land fill at 541-545 Ocean Boulevard, beside "Little Jack's", Ednapearl noted that men from Mr. McGee's office were on the premise, and no fill beyond that determined by that office was placed on the site. She also stated that the State Attorney General had ordered Mr. Fred Schaaque to remove fill in the rear of the St. Magnus Condominium. The Secretary showed pictures of this area and filling, sent to her by Mrs Amman, which are duplicates of those sent to Mr. McGee's office. These are filed in the Secretary's records. Neil made a motion, seconded by Irene, that we continue a close observation on filling both at Bragg Avenue and North Beach Road. This passed unanimously.

New business: Nelson had received the application which we make out and submit to the Budget Comm. for the coming year. It was decided to request five hundred dollars, as has been done in the past. Ruth N. offered to take care of this, and it was so agreed.

Before these minutes were written, word was received of the death of a highly respected and most efficient member of our commission, Ed Loughlin. I sent a sympathy card to Mary, and signed our individual names to it.

Our next meeting will be held on Nov. 22nd.
