

Hampton Conservation Commission

March 28th, 1977

The Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight o'clock, with Ednaparl Parr, Neil MacPherson, Loren Hutchins, Alide Lavallee, Irene Palmer and Ruth Nutter present.

Mr. Ronald B. Dube, of 22 Harbor Road, Hampton Beach, was with us. He came to discuss with us our reasons for objecting to his building a pier, ramp and float stated in a letter written to the Army Corps of Engineers on March first, by this Commission.

Nelson brought out each of our objections, giving Mr. Dube opportunity to answer the questions of the various members, and the following points were thoroughly talked about in detail:

This construction would contribute to boating hazards: It is setting a precedent: It is giving up a great deal of our natural resources to one individual: and it is an intrusion on the shore and beach at the expense of the public.

At nine fifteen, Ednaparl made a motion, seconded by Ruth, that we have lifted our objections as far as the 205 foot pier, 30 foot ramp, and 12 foot float, that Mr. Ronald Dube, 22 Harbor Road, Hampton Beach, is building, and vote that it be completed. This motion passed unanimously, and the Secretary was instructed to inform the Army Corps of Engineers to this effect.

At nine twenty five Nelson opened the business

meeting. The minutes of the February 28th meeting, with the changing of the word business to commercial use, concerning land at Mr. Dube's, were approved as read.

The election of officers was the next order of business. Altho' Nelson told the members that he had been Chairman for a bit of a time, and Ruth assured her colleagues that being Secretary was a most interesting position (it is out of the job class), no one jumped at the opportunity of replacing them. Ednapearl made the motion, seconded by Neil, that the present slate of officers be re-elected. This motion passed unanimously.

Neil gave the Treasurer's report as follows:

Previous balance- \$2386.99. February - interest added-\$84.99, making the present balance \$2471.98.

Ednapearl moved, seconded by Ruth, that the Treasurer send \$25 to the Environmental Coalition, as assistance in carrying out their work. The motion passed unanimously. Loren spoke of his need for the Handbook for Municipal Conservation Commissions in N.H. and Ednapearl volunteered that she would try to obtain one from Malcolm Taylor. The next meeting will be on April 25th. This meeting was adjourned at nine fifty.
