

Hampton Conservation Commission

April 24, 1978

Our Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at 8:25, with Irene Palmer, Ednapearl Parr, William Barklay and Neil MacPherson present. Peter Olney was also in attendance.

The minutes of the March 27th meeting were read. Neil moved that they be accepted as read, seconded by Ednapearl; the vote was unanimous.

Neil gave the following Treasurer's report:

Cash on hand --\$1.59                      Deposited April 11, 1978  
\$685.00                      Interest - \$22.23

Balance On April 11 -- \$3233.08

There was discussion about the fill at the end of High Street by Glenn Bosworth. Nelson received a letter from the Town Manager stating that the town receives copies of all "Dredge and Fill" permits and that they are on file in the Town Office. Regarding Peter Olney's project: Bill Barklay made his report. He saw no reason to push for completion of the agreement, and recommended that it appears that the Conservation Commission has no interest in forcing an earlier date, and that the date of December '78, is acceptable to the Conservation Commission. He recommended that Peter Olney write a letter, as President of his corporation (with his letterhead) confirming his intention as already agreed.

Bill Barklay made a report on the Governor's Southeast New Hampshire Economic Conference, at the Portsmouth Vocational-Technical College, held on April 20, '78. There will be a growth and

population pressure for fifteen years, and will then level off. Co-operation among towns will be important. Vital to have master land use plan-- can control but not by exclusion. Domestic water supply a very serious problem. Possibility of a \$20,000,000 water system for the area. The report is included with this Secretary's report.

Bill brought up status of parking lot at the beach.

No money raised for work this year. Chairman will bring this up next meeting under "old business".

The next meeting will be May 22nd.

This meeting was adjourned at 9:15.
