Hampton Conservation Commission

The April 27th meeting was opened at seven thirty by chairman Peter Randall, with Irene, Ellen and Ruth present. Peter Olney from the Planning board joined us.

The secretary's report was read, and after changing "aerial viewing" to photographs, was accepted as read.

Neil had reported by phone that the treasurer has spent no money since his last report, and had received the first installment of the one thousand dollars voted by the town.

Under old business, Peter spoke of H.B. 423FN, which is the Coastal Zone Management bill. Our plans for Frank Richardson to define prime tidal wetlands, and to make a salt marsh map for us are totally dependent upon the passage of this bill. It has passed in the House, has not yet been voted on in the Senate. Ruth volunteered to contact Senator Preston, and explain to him our interest in this matter, and urge his support.

New business: Peter spoke of the petitions of Mr. Fiumara and Mr. Radkay, the latter under the name of "Consultants Diversified". Both have been denied in Concord, and will have a hearing in Concord on May 5, in the morning, one following the other. Peter plans to attend both hearings.

Mr. Traves approval was reaffirmed. Peter mentioned a petition to fill in the area of the new liquor store to be built, which he did not act upon, feeling the work had probably already been done.

Tuesday evening, the 28th, there will be a wetboards hearing in Rye, at the Town Hall at seven thirty, and Ellen plans to attend.

The Strafford Rockingham Regional Council and U.N.H. Cooperative Extension Service is sponsoring a Major Development Handbook Short Course at the Hotel Ashworth, from 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. on Friday, May 15. Peter plans to attend.

New business: Earl Mott from Newington, wishes to give land that he owns on Drakeside Road to this commission.

Peter Olney said that he had given the necessary information concerning the development rights on lot # A.I in it's subdivision off Winnacumnet Rd. that he is giving us, to Attorney Junkins . As nothing has been heard from him, Ruth was requested to write, to inquire as to the status on development, at this time.

Our next meeting will be one week earlier, on May 18, at seven thirty, due to Memorial Day.
