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Hampton Conservation Commission

The July meeting was held on the 27th, with Chairman Nelson Grant, Neil, Loren, Irene, and Ruth present. Judy represented the planning board and Peter brought some papers to Nelson, but due to a conflicting date with SAPL, could not stay.

The minutes of the June 15th meeting were read, and accepted as read. Neil reported that he had received \$83.34 from the town, and a dividend of \$17.49, making a balance to date of \$3837.82.

Old business: Neil noted that he had discussed investments with the bank officials, asking about the amount of \$3000, for two and a half years. There would be a 12% penalty if any of this amount was withdrawn before maturity. Irene suggested that Neil and Nelson pursue this matter more fully, with a time table of approximately one year, and all agreed with this.

Ruth had received a reply to the letter she had written to Senator Rudman, concerning Land and Water Conservation Fund Aid, and Nelson read this to the members.

Judy spoke of wetlands conservation, a district ordinance and wetland zoning, and gave this board two sets of papers on these subjects, to be used in the study of a definition of wetlands. Ellen and Ruth from this commission, and Judy and Peter Olney from the planning board will start meetings in August, for definite suggestion on this subject. The final result would be drafting a definition of wetlands acceptable to the Wetlands Board of the State of New Hampshire, if we

are successful in our undertaking.

New business:

Judy spoke of a problem at the LaBelle motel on Ocean Boulevard. The pipe from the swimming pool drains into Eel ditch. Loren noted that it should be on every site plan how the swimming pool drains. Nelson suggested that we take this up at our next meeting.

The next meeting will be held on August 24, at seven thirty.

Neil made the motion that this meeting be adjourned at 8:45.
