

## CONSERVATION COMMITTEE MEETING

July 28, 1992

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jim Clifford at 7:00 p.m. Also in attendance were A. Reid Bunker, Vivianne Marcotte, Sheila Nudd, Alberta True and Dave Weber.

### NEW BUSINESS

#### 30 Jones Ave., Hampton, N.H.

Mr. Clifford stated that a site walk was convened at 6:30 this evening. An Application for a deck on the back of the building was submitted. There was no opposition. Mr. Bunker made motion in favor of the Application seconded by Dave Weber, it was

VOTED To accept the application.

#### Marina at Hampton Beach

Mr. Clifford discussed a letter that was sent to the Wetland Board regarding the outer basin. Due to the wrong code on the letter, it was misconstrued. Another letter was sent with the correct code and showed in favor of the inner basin but opposed to the outer basin improvements. Mr. Clifford read the correct letter which was sent.

Mr. Clifford stated that a recent Hampton Beach site walk near the Seabrook line (Ocean Drive) was not advisable to put in concrete.

### TOWN CLOCK

Mr. Ansel Palmer, President of the Historical Society, addressed the commission at this time. His concern was for the Town Clock that was in pieces stored in different locations. The problem being to find a permanent location for the clock that would have security. The blacksmith shop has some of the clock stored in it, put there by the DPW. However, there was no permission given to have it stored there and the question of security for the clock was raised. Glen French, Chairman of the Hampton Beach Area Chamber of Commerce, has stored some of the parts elsewhere.

Ms. Nudd questioned the liability on the clock. The liability is the Town's responsibility.

Mr. Bunker stated that the Commission is caretaker of the Barbour Road land where the victory garden and blacksmith shop are.

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Mr. Clifford asked if Mr. Palmer had it in writing if the clock was Town property. Mr. Palmer answered that it should be found in Town documents.

Mr. Clifford stated he felt that the building was not secure enough for the value of the clock. He also stated the Commission was not properly notified of the fact that the building was chosen to have the clock housed in it. Mr. Clifford suggested that perhaps Mr. French could have the rest of the clock stored where he has the parts.

Mr. Palmer asked for a little more time to find a place for clock and keep the parts in the building until such time that a place is found.

Mr. Clifford stated the Commissions and Historical Society must always work together to accomplish any task.

The Minutes of the last meeting were reviewed.

A typing error on Page 4, 1st paragraph was corrected.

Mr. Clifford questioned Page 2, regarding site walks.

Mr. Bunker explained that this was a concern of the Commissioners for lack of communication.

Ms. Marcotte gave a reprise of Dory Inn. This was on Page 4, paragraph 4. Mr. Bunker asked if he should contact the owner regarding the situation. Mr. Clifford stated that would be fine and to report back to him.

Mr. Bunker moved to approve the Minutes, seconded by Ms. Marcotte, it was

VOTED To approve the Minutes.

Mr. Bunker will post the Minutes in the appropriate place.

The list of commissioners will be corrected.

Rev. Golledge made motion, seconded by Ms. Marcotte, it was

VOTED To send a letter of thanks to the former Secretary of the Commission, Maureen Cummings.

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Mr. Bunker stated the balance in the checkbook is \$4,669.75.  
Mr. Bunker will ask the Treasurer for an update on what the  
recent withdrawals funded.

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, August 25, 1992,
