

Hampton, N.H. Conservation Commission July 2, 1968

The regular meeting of the Hampton Conservation Commission was held at the Hampton court room July 2, 1968. The chairman Miss Ruth Stimpson called the meeting to order at 7:45 p.m. with the following members present, Mrs. Miss Ruth Stimpson, Mrs. Ruth Nutter, Mrs. Mimi Waters, Mrs. Edna Pearl Parr, Mr. Robert Bridle, Mr. Ralph Gould, and Mr. Stillman Hobbs.

The chairman Miss Stimpson ask Mrs. Parr to serve as recording secretary. There were no minutes read of the previous meeting.

A balance of \$170.15 was reported in the Treasure.

Mr. Ralph Gould, appointed by the selectman to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Samuel Towle was welcomed and introduced to the commission.

The following communication were read by the chairman:

1- A letter from Mrs. Charles Rawling reporting she gave 5 acres of marshland to the Society of the Protection of N.H. Forest.

2- One from the N.H. Fish and Game Dept that they had legalized 1½ acres of marshland given by Mrs. Mary S.B. Lane heirs.

3- A letter from Mrs. Barbara Brown that she will give 5½ acres of marshland to the Society for the Protection of N.H. Forest in memory of her father Mr. Myron Brown. B.S.P.

4- A letter from Mr. Cole town manager thanking the commission for the report in the town warrant.

5- A copy of the letter sent to the zoning board objecting to changing the zoning of a lot of land on North Shore Blvd just south of the North Hampton town line.

6- A copy of the letter from the commission sent to the New Hampshire Port Authorities objecting to filling and building homes on Winnacunnet Rd. just west of Eel Ditch on the right side going toward the beach.

7- A letter from Little Boars Head Garden Club with a check for \$50.00 to be used as the commission wishes.

8- A gift of marshland from Mrs. Marilla Brown if the back boundary can be located.

9- A letter from Mrs. Stanley Johnson a member of the ^{Orland} Calif. Conservation Commission stating they were having trouble there trying to save wetlands.

Two members had been reappointed by the selectman Miss Ruth Stimpson and Mrs. Mimi Waters.

The chairman announced two public way signs had been placed at Seabrook Beach section just east of Hampton River Bridge.

Under new business, on motion of Mr. Ruth Nutter it was voted that the Commission place another Bronze marker on the Memorial Boulder at Tidmill Creek for additional names of marshland donors.

On motion of Mr. Ralph Gould it was voted that members of the commission contact the town authorities about placing right away signs at Hampton River landing and Plaice Cove to wet ^{land} and oceans.

Miss Ruth Stimpson, chairman of the commission since it had been formed said she could no longer serve as chairman, but would help anyone elected.

Mr. Robert Bridle nominated Mr. Stillman Hobbs as chairman and Miss Ruth Stimpson as co-chairman. Both were elected.

Mr. Hobbs has been serving as recording secretary for the commission resigned and Mr. Bridle nominated Mrs. Ednapearl Parr as recording secretary. Mrs. Parr was elected.

The meeting adjourned at 10:30 p.m. to meet Tuesday Sept. 10, 1968 at the Hampton court room.
