

HAMPTON CONSERVATION COMM.

JUNE 21 1971

Chairman Peter Randall called the meeting

to order at 8:25 P. M.

The following members were present: Ruth Stimson, Ednapearl Parr, Stillman Hobbs, Ashton Norton, Nelson Grant, and Ruth Nutter.

The Treasurer, Ruth Stimson, reported \$198. 81 in the bank.

Under old business, the secretary was requested to write a letter to Commander "O" of the Coast Guard inquiring about a certain piece of property adjacent to the Smith and Gilmore pier. It is the hope of this Commission that this property might be considered surplus and for purchase for public use by the Town of Hampton.

Letters were also written to Congressman Wyman, Senator McIntyre and Senator Cotton, noting that we would appreciate any assistance that they might give us in this matter, and a carbon copy of the letter sent to Commander "O" was enclosed.

Under new business, unlawful filling of the Marshes was discussed, particular emphasis being pointed to the Trailer Park off King's Highway. Ruth Stimson made a motion, which was duly seconded and passed unanimously, that Peter Randall and Peter Brooks take aerial views of the Hampton Marshes. One roll of thirty six pictures, and that the Commission pay the necessary expense. The question of cycling and recycling was discussed. It was noted that some of the merchants in town would cooperate by placing barrels outside their place of business, but the big problem

would be that of transporting the filled
containers to whatever city would have the
facilities for recycling.

Ruth Stimson will answer a letter received con-
cerning this subject., which was tabled.

Peter is going to write to the Selectmen, inviting
them to meet with us in September.

The next meeting will be held at eight o'clock
on July 15th.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30
