

Hampton Conservation Commission

August 19th, 1971

Chairman Peter Randall called the meeting to order at 8:10.

The following members were present: Ruth Stimson, Stillman Hobbs, Ashton Norton, Ruth Nutter, and Ch. Peter Randall.

The first order of business was the showing of the Aerial views of the marshes taken by Peter. Following this, correspondence was read from the General Services Administration, Sen. Cotton and Sen. McIntyre concerning the Hampton Beach Boathouse site. The Secretary was instructed to write to the two Senators and Congressman Wyman, thanking them for their interest and assuring them that they will be kept apprised of continuing developments.

Peter read a letter from Town Manager Norman Cole, stating that the Selectmen could give us one hour at either the Sept. 10th or 24th meeting of the Selectmen at the Town Office. It was agreed that we would accept the invitation of the evening meeting of Sept. 24th, and Peter will so inform them, hopefully that we can meet very shortly after eight o'clock.

Among the topics to be discussed with them will be : Our forthcoming Questionnaire; the Hampton Beach Boathouse Site; A possible budget for our Commission, and the continuing discussion of the list of town owned properties.

The size of building lots was discussed at some length.

Stillman, Ruth and Ashton presented a sample Questionnaire which they had compiled, each member being given a copy. This was carefully studied and discussed, and some additions were made. Peter volunteered the loan of his Secretary to make the stencil, and Ruth will mimeograph them. Ashton made the motion, seconded by Ruth N. that we have two thousand copies. Methods of distribution were mentioned, specifically ^{to all} the Boy and Girl Scouts, and various Clubs*. Ruth N. to contact members of the Hampton Monday Club. The meeting minutes of the July 15th meeting were read and approved. The meeting was adjourned at 10:20
