

Hampton Conservation Commission

June 23rd, 1975

Our Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at 8:10, with Ed Loughlin, Ruth Stimson, Ednapearl Parr and Ruth Nutter present.

The Secretary's report was read and approved, after changing the wording of a letter sent to Mr. McGee's office that rather than approving the application of John Ziemba, our Commission recommend the approval.

Ednapearl spoke of a Bill that she had sponsored of a two million dollars Federal Land grant, which is in interim study in the Senate Committee, and will be back in November as H. B. 969. She added four other Bills, concerning lakes and other streams may be attached to H. B. 969, which Bill has been approved by the House of Representatives. Mr. McGee has said there will be no filling on wet-lands.

Ruth Stimson reported that there was filling at 99 Glade Path. Ednapearl said that in connection with Mr. Sicard's building plans, two, and possibly three buildings will not be allowed to be constructed. In regard to Ed's report of last month of Mr. McCarthy's operations at the Beach, he has been told to cease and desist.

Ednapearl volunteered to see if an application has been filed for filling at Appledore Street at Fifield Island.

Ednapearl gave all members a copy of the Howard Sibson Final Decision. Also a booklet on "AW Energy Strategy for America".

Mr. Fiumari's application has been turned down in Mr. McGee's office, permission being given for 30 feet only, and this was not satisfactory to Mr. Fiumari.

Nelson read a letter from Neal Socha, asking whether our Commission is supporting or rejecting the proposal to purchase the Sanderson and Weston property. Ruth Stimson made a motion that the Sec. respond to the letter of June 4th<sup>Quote</sup> "that the Cons. Comm. at this time does not feel that we can support the request for 32 acres at \$68,000 that you discussed with us on June 2nd. We feel that your Recreation Commission should consider other alternative sites and their cost of acquisition to serve the over-all goal. May we suggest that we are in unanimous agreement that the potential of Batchelder Park should be explored fully, as it is in ~~the~~<sup>Sched. DISTRICT</sup> ownership until it is needed by the School District for actual building purposes. We will ask the Water Resource Board to evaluate the site that you proposed, and we will be guided by their findings, and will convey the same to you. Again, may we mention for your continuing exploration the following areas: Land off Bashby Road: Flat fields off Mill Road on the Hampton-North Hampton boundary line: Land owned by the following-- Helen Barbour Perkins, Maude Irish, Harold Perkins, Roger James and Eva Guyon." End of quote.

Ruth Nutter called attention to a copy of a Cons. Comm. questionnaire from the N.H. Association of Cons. Comm. Nelson asked Ruth Stimson if she would fill it out, which she agreed to do. During the month

she returned the completed copy to the Secretary. A copy was made for the Secretary's records, and the report was sent to Concord, as requested. The dates of July 28th and August 25th were spoken of for the next two meetings. It was decided that the Secretary call Nelson, to see if there was any business of pressing importance, and then would phone the members as to Nelson's decision. The meeting was adjourned at 9:35.
