

Hampton Conservation Commission

Sept. 22, 1975

Our Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight 00 clock, with Ed Loughlin, Stillman Hobbs and Ruth Nutter present.

The minutes of the July 28th meeting were read and accepted as read. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$1899.64, which was also accepted as read.

Ed Loughlin noted that he was unable to be present at the Atomic Plant hearing in Seabrook on August 25th, and Neil MacPherson read the report of our Commission at this meeting. Ed brought up the subject of open land in Hampton, as a continuing discussion from the Planning Board, and Nelson read from The Enabling Act 36-A:2 that our Commission should keep an index of all open marshlands, swamps, and all other wetlands.

Ed said that the Planning Board was contemplating having aerial views of Hampton made, and Nelson told him he would like copies of same for our records.

Nelson ~~shedd~~ showed an application from George Smith at 3 Ocean Boulevard, ~~eh~~ clearly explaining a necessity for 2000 yards of rock, steel and wool fill, for which he signed his recommendation. We were also shown a notification of Referral from Charles F. Tucker concerning the Master Plan sewer construction and pollution control facility scheduled for construction in '75 and '76 at #6, Plaice Cove, Ext. #8, North East interceptor. Also an application from George Hamilton, Director

of N. H. Parks, concerning a docking facility. The question of the unremoved fill at Brown Ave., was again brought up, and Ruth Nutter gave the list of reasons she obtained from George Hardardt as to why it was still there, to Nelson. After a brief discussion, it was decided to defer further talk to our next meeting, when the full membership would be present.

Ed is going to study the question of the involvement of wetlands on the Aubrey Quinlan construction site, for the purpose of determining the role this Commission can take on this subject.

The next meeting will be held on Monday, October 27th.

The meeting was adjourned at nine O' clock.
