

Hampton Conservation Commission

March 22nd, 1976

The Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight ten, with Irene Palmer, Stillman Hobbs and Ruth Nutter present. Ed Loughlin and Ruth Stimson joined us as soon as previous meetings would allow them.

The minutes of the February 23rd meeting were read and approved as read.

Stillman reported the Treasurer's report was unchanged from the February reading.

Ruth Nutter reported that she had contacted Mr. Chichester concerning the acre of marshland that was located in Hampton, and sold to Public Service. He did not know who had previously owned it, and it was suggested that she ask Ednapearl if she could find out if it were privately or town owned property.

After some discussion, Nelson said that he would write to the Selectmen, urging that those whose term had ended on the Commission, be re-appointed. Under new business, Nelson presented an application for permit to fill 2500 square yards at 541-545 Ocean Boulevard (estimated amount) from Henry E. Farr. The request is for proposed construction of a 24 unit motel with an apartment.

After discussion, Ruth Nutter made the motion, "that this request involves our Commission due to the filling of wetlands, and that we oppose the application". Stillman Hobbs seconded the motion, all voting in favor except Nelson.

The Secretary was instructed to write to George McGee of the Special Board Water Resources of our decision.

In a letter from the Environmental Coalition, a request was made for a donation from our Commission, as an aid in their continuing work. As twenty five dollars were donated to them in February, Ed made the motion, seconded by Ruth Stimson, that we do not send any money at this time. This was voted unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at ten O' clock.
