

Hampton Conservation Commission

April 26, 1976

The Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight fifteen, with Ed Loughlin, Edna Pearl Parr, Irene Palmer and Ruth Nutter present. The two new members, Mr. MacPherson and Mr. Lavalley were unavoidably out of town, so they could not be with us.

The minutes of the March 22nd meeting were read and accepted as read.

Under old business, it was noted that there would be a public hearing in Concord on April 27th, concerning the request for a permit to fill 2500 square yards at 541-545 Ocean Boulevard, submitted by Henry E. Farr. The Secretary had written to Mr. McGee of the Special Board Water Resources following our March meeting, that we opposed the application, and had received a letter (copy) from the Selectmen, sent to Mr. McGee, also stating their opposition. The Secretary gave these two letters to Ed Loughlin, who would go to Concord on Tuesday, to represent our Commission. Nelson had received a letter from Charles F. Tucker, South Eastern Regional Planning Commission, recommending approval to Mr. Farr's request, subject to the condition that virgin marsh adjacent to the property not be disturbed. Under new business, Nelson had an application from the Department of Public Works and Highways (Bridge design) concerning the bridge at Taylor River, between Hampton and Hampton Falls.

Project: To replace the old, inadequate structure and raise road grade above frequent flooding.

To be dredged . 300 Cubic yards

To be filled 1500 Cubic yards

This Commission voted no protest.
