

Hampton Conservation Commission

January 24th, 1977

The Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight ten, with Ednapearl Parr, Al Lavallee, Loren Hutchins, and Ruth Nutter present. The minutes of the November 22nd meeting were read. Ednapearl moved, seconded by Al, that the minutes be accepted as read, motion carried. Nelson read the annual report, written by the Secretary, which will be printed in the Town Warrant. Ruth reported on our financial figures, which had to be submitted to the State Auditors on Monday morning, the 24th, and which she did as our Treasurer is out of town. Our figures were in complete agreement with those of the Auditors. Ednapearl reported that she took pictures of the area in the rear of the St. Magnus Condominium to Mr. McGee to prove to him that filling had been continuing as long as the weather allowed. Mr. McGee called Fred Schaaque on the phone and told him that he was in violation, and that as soon as weather permitted, all filling must be removed. The land in question has been declared a water-shed.

New Business: The Secretary was instructed to write a letter to Mr. McGee concerning the application for 500 Cubic yards of dredging at the Hampton River Boat Club, signed by Richard Carroll, Commodore, HRBC. This Commission does not oppose the petition.

Ednapearl spoke in detail of the procedure which is necessary to pursue, in order to obtain per-

mission to dig out existing ditches on the  
marsh, for mosquito control.

Forms have to be filled out by all the Seacoast  
towns involved in this, and sent to the Army  
Engineers in Waltham, for their approval. Ruth  
Stimson is taking care of this.

The next meeting will be held on February 28th.  
This meeting was adjourned at eight forty five.
