

Hampton Conservation Commission

April 25th, 1977.

Our Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight ten, with Loren Hutchins, Neil MacPherson and Ruth Nutter present.

The minutes of the March 28th meeting were read, Neil moved, and Loren seconded, that they be accepted as read. Our treasurer, Neil, gave the following report:

Under old business, Loren spoke on Flood Plain insurance, noting that it must be renewed or close out the program. The map is constantly changing and no federal monies are available to banks for loaning, unless the Town goes along with Federal procedures. Septic systems are part of the package, and the Planning Board might draw up an ordinance on trailers.

New business: Nelson would like to carry a program on indexing for several months, and on the agenda would be questions such as: how should we go about it? to what extent? What does it mean according to law or to us?

Loren made a motion that the Secretary write to Malcolm Taylor, Executive Secretary of the N. H. Ass'n of Conservation Commissions, telling him our problem and asking for any suggestions he might have on our procedure. Also, if he could tell us of another Conservation Commission that had done this, and to whom we could write. Ruth seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. Neil made the motion, seconded by Ruth, that our dues of \$95 be paid to the N. N. Ass'n of Conservation Commissions, which passed unanimously. A letter was read from The Clam Shell Alliance, stating that a meeting was to be held at the State Park, Hampton, on May 1st. We were invited to attend and if unable, the Alliance suggested that we write a letter, which could be read by them to those attending, stating our reaction to the Nuclear plant under construction in Seabrook. After discussion, Loren moved, seconded by Neil, that we do not write the proposed letter. Motion was carried unanimously. The next meeting will be on May 23rd. This meeting was adjourned at eight forty five.
