

Hampton Conservation Commission

May 23rd, 1977.

Our Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight O' clock, with Ednaparl Parr, Al Lavallee, Irene Palmer and Ruth Nutter present.

The minutes of the April 25th meeting were read. Ednaparl moved, and Al seconded, that they be accepted as read.

Ednaparl attended the May first meeting at the State Park in Hampton, sponsored by SAPL, in a continuing effort to present their views on the construction of the Nuclear plant in Seabrook.

She brought to us some of the points covered:

" Public Service has requested 15.9 % added to the consumer's monthly bill - this would be 15 years on line, at least.

There is a ten year supply of Uranium in our country, Australia is the only other country which has it.

There are two hundred children in the Children's Hospital in Boston, suffering from lukemia, bone cancer and lung cancer. All of these 200 children have one thing in common-- parents who have worked in nuclear plants " End of quote.

Wednesday evening, May 25th, a very important ^{hearing} / will be held at the Jr. Academy, on Senate Bill 189, on Coastal Planning. a N. H. coastal zone study. This will be presented by a commission thru' the State Legislature, Betty Greene of Rye, Chairman. Ednaparl stressed the importance of this meeting, and urged all to attend who could possibly do so.

At our last meeting, Nelson told us that he would like to carry a program on indexing, and following a motion of the members, the Secretary wrote to Malcolm Taylor, of the State Conservation Commission, requesting any information he could send us on the subject. He sent a very helpful letter, enclosing five computer summary printout sheets, the result of a field survey by the N. E. Natural Areas Project. The sheet on the Hampton River Estuary seemed to be the one of most interest to us, so I had copies made of it so that each member could have one to study. These were given to those present, and this will be discussed more fully at our next meeting, which will be on June 27th.
