

Hampton Conservation Commission

July 24th, 1978.

Our Chairman, Nelson Grant, opened the meeting at eight o'clock with Bill Barklay, Loren Hutchins, Ednapearl Parr, Irene Palmer and Ruth Nutter present. John and Margaret Hilchey and Leonard Woodman were also present, as the Hilcheys wished to discuss their petition to fill on their property on Pearl Street. Mr. Hilchey brought a map with him which showed the lot in question to be the fourth off Gill Street. Irene had inspected the area, and as there appeared to be more questions arise as the lots were discussed, it was decided that we meet with the Hilcheys this coming Thursday evening at seven o'clock, inspect the area ourselves and then come to a decision. Mr. Woodman stated that the fill would be 12 to 15 inches in depth.

After the Hilcheys and Mr. Woodman left, the Secretary read the report of the June 26 meeting. One correction was made- namely that we did not owe Mr. Ryan \$22.65 for his work on Gertrude Sherburne's gift of marshland, but the \$22.65 was paid to the Registry of Deeds, to file the deed. With this correction made, the minutes were accepted as read. *for our annual dues.* Nelson had a bill of \$95 from the N. H. Association of Conservation Commissions. Ednapearl made the motion, seconded by Irene, that the Treasurer pay this bill, which received an unanimous vote. Continuing with old business, Nelson reported that our Commission was invited to the

Selectmen's office on July 28, at one P. M. with various Town Officials. A traffic problem at Rte. #101E, at the intersection of Winnacunnet and Landing Roads, better known as Elmwood Corner, will be under discussion. It was suggested that as many as possible attend.

Irene reported that she had checked into the figure allowed for the expense of anyone travelling on school business, and that it was 12 cents a mile for car expenses. It was decided that we submit a motion to be voted on, covering this question, and several ideas were submitted. As the actual wording seemed to be elusive, Nelson asked that we all think of exact wording on this motion, and bring it to our next meeting. New Business: Loren said that the Planning Board did not approve of all of Mr. Luck's plans for building, due to the proximity of wells, and the procedure is indefinite at this point. Nelson asked that we consider the previously discussed idea of inviting a student from the High School, possibly suggested by one of the teachers, who would be interested in Conservation to join us in some of our meetings or endeavors.

Our next meeting will be on August 28. This meeting was adjourned at 9:30.
