

Hampton Conservation Commission

May 21, 1979.

Our Chairman, Peter Randall, opened the meeting at eight o'clock with Nelson Grant, Ednaparl Parr, Neil MacPherson and Ruth Nutter present. Sandra Gurick joined us later in the evening, having a previous commitment.

The minutes of the April 23rd meeting were read, and approved as read. The Treasurer reported an April balance of \$3840.90 . Expenses-- \$95.00, annual dues to the N. H. Association of Conservation Commissions, 33 cents, petty cash, leaving a balance of cash on hand of \$3745.57. This report was accepted as read.

The subject of the three duplex buildings under construction at 475 High Street , Dan Stone builder, was next discussed. Ednaparl noted that she had personally spoken to George McGee about this. Vern Knowlton made a third visit to the site, and found evidence of heavy equipment tracks on the marsh.

The workmen were ordered to keep heavy equipment off the marsh, otherwise no violation was found. The secretary was requested to write a letter to George McGee, asking the name of the persons who had checked on the complaints, the dates visited, and their determinations.

Peter brought up the subject of our meeting with the Planning Board, and after some discussion, it was decided that Peter would speak to Loren Hutchins, and invite them to meet with us to pursue subjects of mutual interest.
