

Hampton Conservation Commission

March 24, 1980

Chairman Peter Randall opened the meeting at seven o'clock with Nelson Grant, Ednapearl Parr, Irene Palmer and Ruth Nutter in attendance.

The minutes of the January 28th, February 25th, and March 10th were read, and voted accepted as read. Due to illness, Neil was absent, so no treasurer's report was given.

Old business: Ednapearl reported on the meeting that she attended in Concord regarding pesticides used in mosquito control. As it stands now, everyone will not have to be notified if one person raises objections, and hazardous materials will have other, not so questionable, substituted when necessary.

Nelson reported on telephone conversations with Mr. Traves, who was concerned with violations on filling, in the area of his home. It was decided that the day following this meeting, Nelson and Peter would go down to Ocean Boulevard and inspect the areas in question. There are five reported fillings and Peter will call Mr. McGee's office for someone to come down and make an inspection.

Concerning our planned project on wetlands indexing, Peter noted that he had (~~three~~) copies made of the outline of his work that Barry Keith left with us, and gave one to the Planning Board and one to the Selectmen, asking that any comments be made by this date, our regular meeting night. There was no response from either. Peter read letters of recommendation from David Sorenson and the

Co-operative Extension Service, Carroll County
Office, Conway.

Ednaparl made the motion that we employ Barry
Keith to do our wetlands indexing, as proposed
in his letter to us of Feb. 13, 1980. Ruth Nutter
seconded the motion, and the vote was unanimous
in favor.

New Business: Batchelder Park was discussed, the
many possibilities that it offered, including
the question of a conservation easement.

It was mentioned that the owners of the Reef motel,
near the stone house, would like to convert it to
a condominium.

Our next meeting will be held on April 28th.
