

Hampton Conservation Commission

June 2nd, 1980

Chairman Peter Randall opened the meeting at 7 o'clock with Nelson Grant, Neil MacPherson, Loren Hutchins, and Ruth Nutter present. Edna Pearl Parr was with us until seven thirty, at which time she had a previous commitment. Loren introduced Mr. Greenwood, a fellow teacher from the Jr. High, and he, in turn, introduced the seventh grade students who had participated in the project at Batchelder's Pond. We were given completed work books showing in detail all that was accomplished, each of the students submitting written reports, maps and drawings, all neatly and comprehensively done. There was a discussion period, and the students answered all the questions requested of them.

After they left, the secretary read the April 28th minutes, which were accepted as read. Neil gave the treasurer's report, stating that he had been given a check for \$2570.00 which we had requested.

Two payments, each for \$700, have been made to Barry Keith, and \$67.25 was sent to the Yankee Printer for new stationery, leaving a balance of \$5489.03. Under old business, Peter said that Barry was 60% done on the aerial view, and test 2 will be completed in mid to late June. For our records, it was unanimously voted that the second bill of \$700 be paid. As this meeting was a postponement of our May meeting, due to the holiday, it was decided our next meeting will be on June 23rd.

Peter brought up the following violations:  
dredging and filling in back of the Wave Motel,

and owner ordered by the Army Corps of engineers to comply to their orders on the violation ~~by~~ by May 27; Robert O'Neil, off Auburn Avenue, ordered to remove fill; a Mr. Witham, 549 Ocean Blvd. is the site viewed by this commission, and in this particular instance, it was decided to offer no objection to his request; Mr. Danielian-- no longer owns the property, this may require action in the future. A request from Henry J. Stonie for 2000 cu. yards of fill for a one family house on Rte. 1A, on land adjoining or near Quinlan's, and Huckleberry Lane. It was decided that we would do a site inspection during the next thirty days.

New business: We were invited to the Rye Library Conference room on Wednesday, June 11th, by the Rye Conservation Commission, to view slides on the marsh and estuaries. Loren reported that the recommendations cover about all that can be done at Batchelder's pond at this point. Peter suggested that he might attend a school meeting and request that the school property ownership revert to the Conservation commission. It was noted that we have a meeting with Loren and Mr. Greenwood, to discuss what they would like to do, and how to accomplish this end. The secretary was instructed to write letters to Mr. Annis, Principal of Hampton Academy, and to Mrs Walker, Chairman of the Hampton school board, showing our interest and appreciation, and stating our desire for this project to continue. Ruth made the motion, seconded by Nelson, that Loren proceed along the same program as pursued to this point. Passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at nine thirty.
