

Hampton Conservation Commission

September 22, 1980

Chairman Peter Randall opened the meeting with Nelson Grant, Neil MacPherson and Ruth Nutter present, Loren Hutchins joining us shortly.

The secretary's report was read and accepted as given. The treasurer reported a balance of \$4,056.83 as of August 26.

Peter noted that he had sent news of our activities to the Conservation Commission News for the October issue.

Ednapearl sent word that she had personally delivered her resignation to the board of Selectmen. Barry Keith phoned that he was delayed in Concord, and Peter suggested that he not try to attend this meeting, due to the lateness of his arrival. As soon as he obtains the mylars, his project for us will be finished. Loren reported that any file cabinets he had seen priced around one hundred dollars were not a good buy. He had seen one that he considered satisfactory, with a lock, for \$114. Nelson made a motion that \$14 be added to the \$100 already voted, Loren seconded, and the vote was unanimous.

New business: Peter reported that the Town Manager called him in reference to work being done on the sea wall at the Bicentennial park. The necessary equipment was there, and Mr. Richards wanted the 10 day period waived, so Peter signed the necessary papers. Peter read a letter written to Norman Royal from the Corps of Engineers, ordering him to Cease and Desist continued violations of fill-

ing wetland on Brown Avenue. This referred to Building 1, 1A and 3. He was given 30 days to answer, specific questions and follow directions, Peter received the application form for the 1980 budget, and this was discussed in detail. It was established that we had \$3, 686 before receiving last year's \$2570. Our new budget was determined. Loren made a motion that Peter evaluate the pictures he has recently taken from a plane, and if, in his opinion, more pictures would be desirable, Peter be given up to \$125 for additional pictures. Ruth seconded, the vote was unanimous. Peter noted that our next meeting, October 27, might be a public meeting. Also that a wetland zoning ordinance might be a new project to be studied at the completion of Brian's work. This meeting was adjourned at 8:45.
