Hampton Conservation Commission

The May 18th meeting was opened at seven thirty by chairman Peter Randall with Ellen, Nelson, and Ruth present. Judy Doyle was here representing the Planning board.

The secretary's minutes were read and accepted as read. There is a balance of \$3620.07 in our treasury.

Old business: Peter feels there is a possibility that the Wetlands Board will not grant the petition of either Mr. Radkay or Mr. Fiumara. Peter received a letter from Barry Keith concerning his testimony at a recent hearing in Concord.

Nelson attended the Major Development Project Handbook Short Course held May 15, at the Ashworth. An Impact Check List was given to each of us, that he received at the Major Residential Development meeting, one of three in the program.

Peter spoke of a wetlands ordinance, and questioned should we join with the Planning Board in this project. It is hoped that Federal funds will come into Hampton, to strengthen the work of creating this ordinance. Ruth and Ellen volunteered to meet with the Planning Board to review wetland areas in surrounding territory.

Ruth noted that she had received a letter from Mr. Rudman's office, concerning Land and Water Conservation Fund Aid. As of Jan.1,1981, our state had available for state and local conservation and recreation purposes \$4.6 million. \$2.2 million was in the President's rescission order, and no money for state and local use beginning Oct.1,'81. Ruth will reply to this letter.

Loren requested that our June meeting be held on the 15th, in order that two of his pupils come to the meeting with him and read a report that they have completed on the marshes at Landing Road. It was so voted, to start at seven thirty.

On Thursday, June 11, there will be a meeting of the Citizen's Task Force on Hazardous Waste At the Exeter Town Hall. Peter feels this Commission could well adopt this problem as a future project, several areas to look into in this town. It was suggested that Ednaparl be contacted at our July meeting, to check on her progress with the nameplates of donors of marsh property. Peter spoke of the election of officers at our next meeting.

This meeting was adjourned at eight forty five.
