Hampton Conservation Commission

The June meeting of this commission was held on the 15th, so that Loren could bring seven of his pupils to report on their studies of the marsh.

Chairman Peter Randall opened the meeting at seven thirty, with Neil, Nelson, Irene, Loren, Ellen and Ruth present. Judy Doyle attended from the planning board.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and accepted as read. The treasurer reported the present balance of \$3620.07.

Peter told us that Mr. Fiumara's application was turned down. A rehearing on Mr. Radkay's application will be held in Concord on June 23rd. Peter read a letter from Mr. Tetler, stating reasons why denying the application was wrong. Douglas Woodward from Newcastle is on the wetlands board, and he viewed the site in question. Nelson will send a second letter to Mr. McGee concerning our position on Mr. Radkay's rehearing. Ruth spoke of the phone calls she had received from Mr. LeBlanc, and <sup>told him</sup> that our chairman would be the one to contact, as soon as he received the application to dredge and fill.

Peter noted that the election of officers was the next order of business. Irene nominated Nelson to serve as chairman, seconded by Neil. Nelson noted that he had served in that office for several years, and would prefer someone else be elected. Nelson nominated Loren, which was seconded, and voted by secret ballot. The secretary reported the vote was a tie, three to three. To break the tie, Peter voted, and Nelson was elected. Ruth and Neil were re-elect-

ed to serve as secretary and treasurer for the coming year.

Ellen and Loren agreed to work together in the fall on Marsh day.

Loren introduced the seven students who gave each of us a notebook on the Salt Marsh Analysis Research and Conservation. This was a comprehensive and well done project, covering the following studies: Statistics on the salt marsh: Soil Analysis: Mariculture: Food Webs: Power by Tide, Solar and Wind: Rules and Regulations: Construction: and Cartography (making maps). Each of those present spoke of their work, and many of them will continue this project in the fall.

The July meeting will be held on the 27th, at 7:30.
