Minutes of Meeting
June 2, 1987

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

The minutes of the previous meeting on May 28, 1987 were reviewed and accepted subject to two amendments regarding Part II of Hampton Venture Associate's plan ...the first to eliminate reference to the State Wetlands Board's approval and state that Dr. Richardson had reviewed and was in support of the plan. The second amendment is in reference to the nine-lot subdivision at Old Fifield and Woodland Roads--the redesign on Lot 4 refers to a drainage redesign. The minutes have been redrawn with the corrections.

The members commented on the various projects bordering wetland areas and the general consensus was that the Building Inspector should record and mark construction areas bordering the wetlands with appropriate markers to quell any questions on encroachment. The Chairman will memo the Building Inspector in this regard.

An application for a pier and float at Hampton Harbor by James Hurrell was reviewed. After discussion centering around navigational concerns, mussel beds and neighboring wharfs, a motion was made by Mrs. Palmer and seconded by Mrs. Dumaine, that the Commission will not oppose the proposed wharf as long as it does not interfere with navigation. The vote was unanimous.

The Treasurer's vacancy caused by Mr. Bridle's resignation was discussed and on a motion made by Mr. Grant and seconded by Mrs. Dumaine, James Clifford was nominated for Treasurer contingent on his acceptance. The account with the Piscataqua Savings Bank was discussed and moving this account to a more local bank will be investigated.

The Chairman shared a letter with the members regarding concerns of the residents of the Woodland Road area and development there. Also discussed was a letter from the Office of State Planning concerning the Coastal Program and issues which relate to this.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m.
