Minutes of Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

A Dredge and Fill Application from Wallace McPherson of 1 Huckleberry Lane was presented for review. Mr. McPherson is seeking permission to place 50' of rip rap along the edge of his property for bank stabilization. After discussion, the members decided to defer their decision until they had made a site inspection.

An application from Allen Morgan of 549 Ocean Boulevard to raise the parking area behind his house to prevent flooding at high tide was also discussed. After much discussion, a decision is deferred until the members have had an opportunity to do a site inspection.

In regard to the site inspections, the members of the Commission will meet at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 2 beginning at Huckleberry Lane.

A Dredge and Fill Application was also presented for the State of New Hampshire (Department of Transportation, Bureau of Public Works) regarding the replacement of the sea wall at the beach. The Conservation Commission will not oppose this work.

The Application for Special Permit from the Town of Hampton for the new four-bay garage and office addition at Public Works was reviewed. On a motion made by Mr. Clifford and seconded by Mrs. Lawrence, the Commission will accept the proposed plan as presented which includes the removal of existing drains. The vote was unanimous.

The Chairman discussed the Land Conservation Advisory Committee and the upcoming appointments to the Board. The goals of this committee were discussed and those suggested for appointment are,

along with Peter Tilton, Jr.

A motion was made by Mrs. Dumaine and seconded by Mrs. Palmer, to approve the list of names as submitted. The vote was unanimous.

Mr. Barkley mentioned various parcels of land which the committee should pursue interest in including a parcel at the site of the Grist Mill on High Street. He felt this would be an important acquisition as it could improve the spillway and does border town-owned land.

For information only, the Chairman mentioned Enviro Systems (a previous applicant) stating the company must satisfy the requirements of the Coastal Program. Also mentioned was a publication by the Coast Alliance entitled "Contamination of New England's Fish and Shellfish" which deals with pollution and other problems along the coast of New England. The Chairman also advised the members he had received a memo from Dona Janetos concerning the preliminary budget for 1988.

The Chairman reported he had received a complaint from a resident of Island Path concerning land fill by a neighbor which has caused flooding on his property. The Chairman reviewed the site and has referred the matter to Hampton's Building Inspector and Bob Prokop of the State Wetlands Board.

The Chairman also informed the members that the State Wetlands Board is acting on the Green project off Barbour Road which allegedly proceeded without the necessary permits.

There being no further business to come before the Hampton Conservation Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
