VII. Town Manager's Report

1. It appears that the DPW has expended its entire winter snow budget bottom line that includes the following sub-line items: Overtime wages, Hired equipment, Salt and winter sand. We are slowly clearing out the lettered streets. The High Street Parking Lot is in need of removal of a very large volume of snow that will fill the lower area and block Swains Court if not removed. Long range forecasts have projections for added large amounts of snow fall over the next month.
2. The Town participated with our Senator and State Representatives and a number of other communities in supporting a bill to repeal the Air and Water Pollution Control statute that reduces the taxability of the Seabrook Station by reducing its valuation by \$63 million dollars.
3. Our Senator and State Representatives are very busy in Concord trying to make sure that our State reimbursements and agreements for aid are fully funded in the coming 2 year State Budget.
