



Hampton's Trash & Recycling Curbside Collection Program



The Town of Hampton has a program to collect recyclables and dispose of waste which has many benefits including substantial cost reductions for taxpayers, ease of use, cleaner look, fewer instances of animal interference, and going **GREEN!**

In 2009, Hampton began mandatory recycling at approximately 17%. In 2010 & 2011 we recycled approximately 30%. We must do better if we are to reach our goal of 50%.

The more we Recycle, the more Money we save!

- ♻️ Town issued carts must be used: **Green** for recyclables and **Blue** for trash. It is recommended that containers be marked with the street address.
- ♻️ Trash must fit within the cart with the lid closed.
- ♻️ Recyclables, including flattened corrugated cardboard, may be co-mingled (no sorting by type needed) and must **not be put in plastic bags**. They should be compacted (broken down) so as to maximize space and must fit within the cart with the lid closed. Shredded paper should be placed in paper bags or boxes (**not in plastic bags**).
- ♻️ Trash and recyclables outside the cart will not be picked up.
- ♻️ Carts must be placed at curbside no earlier than 12 hours before pick up and no later than 5:00 AM on collection day. Residents are encouraged to register for automatic e-mail and text message alerts pertaining to snow storm delays on the town web site.
- ♻️ Carts should be separated by approximately 3 feet and 3 feet away from other objects (such as mailboxes, fences, telephone poles, vehicles, walls, etc.) They must be clear of low overhanging branches or structures. Lid opening must face the road.
- ♻️ Trash & recyclables are also accepted at the Transfer Station. A town parking sticker which may be obtained at the Town Office is required.
