Call to order 7:00 P.M. by Chair Ann Carnaby with a salute to

Minutes of Feb 23, 2023 meeting approved. Motion by Erika de Vries;
seconded by Katherine Harak

Historical house marker program was discussed with Ann
Carnaby reporting that there have been 6 new applications for markers to date.
Chuck Rage suggests a sample marker be on display at upcoming town elections.
He will contact Town Moderator Bob Casassa to determine if it would be allowed.

The What Is It-Where Is It Map of Hampton brochure was described by Ann
Carnaby noting that it is a project to increase awareness of Hampton's history.
Funding of \$1000 has been donated to pay for the first printing of the
brochure. Chuck Rage suggests the Commission seek funding for a second printing of
this and future brochures from the Hampton selectmen.

Discussion continued around the plan for a Black Heritage plaque honoring
Franklin D. Roosevelt. Ann Carnaby and Christine Bushway met with the
Deborahs Cooper, Director of the Town Library, regarding placement of the plaque
on property in front of the library which is across the street from where the
Roosevelt's former home was located. Deborahs Cooper was very enthusiastic
about the plan and will present it to the Library Trustees for approval. The
plaque will be bronze and embedded in a large rock.

Under old business Ann Carnaby announced that Betty Moore of the
Hampton Historical Society will carry out the photo documentation of the
property at 111 W. Main Street and before certain historic buildings are taken
