Appointment - Travis Pryor, GEI consultant to HBAC Master Plan

His report will be finished by the end of the month.

Images will be placed on the front cover, a list of acronyms will be included, changes and edits are included based on final inputs submitted. He has expanded on SLR recommendations and also changed the recommendation to create an HBAC staff position to having HBAC work with the Town's Coastal Resilience coordinator,

He (Travis) has moved the recommendations section & action plan and addressed project implementations.



There will be a PDF tomorrow and a grant wrap-up meeting will be held via zoom July 6th. The Planning Board vote to adopt will probably be at it's boards' second meeting in August.

Kravitz offered thanks and congratulations to Travis.

Vote to accept report moved by Rage, seconded by Preston - unanimous.

Chair Stiles asked for a vote to authorize her to have 50 hard copies of the final report made. Moved Rage, second Loiseau, vote unanimous.

Stiles asked Loiseau to report on the first meeting of the town Master Plan Implementation committee meeting last night, since he is our representative. He reported that there was an overview of the Master Plan; there are 145 recommendations within the 5 themes of the plan and they will first work on prioritize them.

The Chamber of Commerce did not get the grant project they applied for, and SHEA did get awarded one that was similar.

Chair discussed that in recent years we have accomplished transportation and environment updates to the original HBAC Master Plan, and it seems to be time to look into the economic section and then bridge them each into one book.

Kravitz discussed examining Travis' report in terms of what will be required to bring us to advancement & stability.

Travis discussed his recommendations for the near term to 2050 and the longer-term activities are for 2070 but that we need to start planning for them soon because putting these kinds of plans take considerable time and money to put in place.

We need to figure out what it will take to reach sustainability.

The Master Plan Implementation Committee (MPIC) will meet monthly through November, take December off, then meet every other month through 2024.

The next meeting will be September 28

Loiseau suggests that HBAC can help with the beach related ordinances being looked at by the Implementation Committee.

Kravitz reports that the Flood Smart Committee met yesterday and are planning some ordinance revisions for various SLR regulations.
